Eligibility Requirements

Under this scholarship a Pell-eligible student whose parent or guardian died in the line of duty while performing as a public safety officer is eligible to receive a maximum Pell Grant for the award year (up to \$6,895 for the 2022-23 award year) for which the determination of eligibility is made. To qualify for this grant, the student must be Pell-eligible and be less than 24 years of age or enrolled at an institution of higher education at the time of his or her parent's or guardian's death. In subsequent award years, the student will continue to be eligible for the scholarship, as long as the student has a Pell-eligible Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) and continues to be an eligible student.

For purposes of the Children of Fallen Heroes Grant, a public safety officer is:

- As defined in Section 1204 of Title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C.3796b); or
- A fire police officer, defined as an individual who is serving in accordance with State or local law as an officially recognized or designated member of a legally organized public safety agency and provides scene security or directs traffic in response to any fire drill, fire call, or other fire, rescue, or police emergency, or at a planned special event.
