Pensacola State College	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Florida college • Multi-campus institution • No campus presidents • Similar size to Edison with 28,000 students • Offer baccalaureate degrees
Hillsborough Community College	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Florida college • Multi-campus institution • College president with 5 campus presidents
St. Petersburg College	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Florida college • Multi-campus institution • College president • Campuses have provosts not presidents • 45,000 students enrolled in credit programs; additional 18,000 non-credit
Georgia Perimeter College	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Multi-campus institution with 4 campuses and one center • Similar in size to Edison with 25,500 students enrolled • Primarily a 2-year institution, approved to offer limited baccalaureate degrees • No campus presidents – college president • Campus deans report to College VP
Ivy Tech College System	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Large community college system state-wide • College president with regional chancellors
University of South Carolina – Aiken	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Campus of University of South Carolina – 3200 students enrolled • Campus chancellor reports to USC President • Decentralized • Divisional vice chancellors
