I. Updates:

Status of QEP document

Pam Mangene reported that good progress continues on the QEP. The four subcommittees have submitted documents related to course content, which will be collated, added to, and revised as an initial draft. Stuart Hunter will be returning on August 10 to work with us on further revisions. During the fall semester, course content will be reviewed by faculty and revised yet again prior to the launch of Cornerstone Experience in Spring 2012.

Lead Faculty

Pam announced that Myra Hale, Professor of Speech, has agreed to serve as the lead faculty member for Cornerstone Experience. Myra will join the members of the QEP Steering Committee next week to continue development of the QEP document and work on course content.

Marketing Committee and Cornerstone Logo-

Maureen McClintock previewed the Cornerstone website which should be completed next week. The marketing committee is procuring inexpensive Cornerstone Experience promotional items for faculty, staff and students. Maureen and Meg Hawthorne are working on a brochure.

Cornerstone Experience Professional Development

Pam reported that the dates/time of Cornerstone Experience trainings related to certification are posted to the TLC webpage and included in the Fall brochure in red ink.

Linked Courses

Pam said that because cohorts are essential to linked courses in research studies, we will be calling those "companion courses". The Applied Learning subcommittee is recommending that ENC 1101 and ENC 9020 be companion courses in the spring 2012 semester, and that everyone teaching sections of those courses be trained in the fall. Relevancy will be addressed through Cornerstone Experience course sections to be taught by faculty members representing the respective tracks (disciplines) and through class assignments and projects. The goal is for the course to be a meaningful and life-altering experience for first-time students.

II. Other

Professor Manacheril suggested that relevant handouts may work better than a textbook, particular in the first semester.
