## **Exploration Trip to the University of Central Florida**

In October of 2011, the Students Support Services (SSS) Program traveled to Orlando for an exploration trip to the University of Central Florida (UCF). Every semester the SSS Program takes students out to explore different colleges and universities in the state of Florida. In doing so, the SSS Students have an oppor-

During their time at UCF, the SSS students learned about the different dorm styles available to students who attend UCF. Two student ambassadors provided a tour of the traditional dormitories as well as the apartment style dorms. The SSS students then explored the UCF campus. By exploring the campus on their own, SSS students were given the opportunity to learn the things that interest them the most about the university. They visited the UCF Student Government Association (SGA) to learn more about the student body leadership opportunities. Some students visited with academic advisors who provided useful information about the transfer process and majors.

The SSS students came together and enjoyed lunch at Knightro's Café. One of UCF's main dining locations. While at the café, the SSS Students were joined by Edison State College SSS Alumni and they had the opportunity to ask questions and see how former SSS students are living. Later in the day, the SSS students went to an information session provided by one of the UCF admission's counselors. She explained the admissions process, as well as the detailed information on majors and grade point averages needed to be accepted into some of the programs at UCF. She also talked about the different scholarships available to students that apply early. After the information session, a new set of student ambassadors gave the SSS students a campus tour. They took us to the classrooms and demonstrated the different type of classroom setting available to UCF students. SSS students were taken to the different academic buildings and departments.

The ambassadors also took the students to the UCF Fountain where the school hosts a grand pep rally event to kick off the semester. After the visit to the UCF Fountain the students were shown the Recreation and Wellness Center which is fully supported by the SGA of UCF. At the end of the campus tour, the SSS students returned to the charter bus and headed back home to Fort Myers. The trip to UCF was a great success. The SSS students exhibited an exceptional demeanor while away from home. It was great to meet up with alumni and learn how
