Performance Matters:

- Florida Southwestern Collegiate High School Charlotte has received accreditation from AdvancED from July 2014 to June 2019.
- Juniors Zachary Keppler, Oliver Mueller, Zachary Upright, and Peter Yurkovich received perfect scores on the sophomore FCAT 2.0 Reading test.
- Sophomore Nicole Constance received a perfect score on the freshman FCAT 2.0 Reading test.
- Juniors Zachary Keppler, Michelle Mings, and Zachary Upright received perfect scores on the state U.S. History End-of-Course exam.
- Art teacher Amy Porter attended a week-long conference at the Massachusetts College of Art in July. The focus of the conference was Teaching Artistic Behavior (TAB), a concept that "enables students to experience the work of the artist through authentic learning opportunities and responsive teaching."
- Guidance counselor Amber Foster attended the American School Counselor Association conference in Orlando. A highlight of the conference was an address by Michelle Obama.
- This summer assistant principal Matthew Catanzarite and Spanish teacher Lisa Tayloe began work on their doctorates in educational leadership at Florida Southern College.

Performance Matters:

- Standardized Test data has returned over the summer and once again, FSWC Lee outperforms other district schools in all categories. Preliminary calculations indicate a school grade of "A" will be issued when the state releases final results in the fall.
- All student schedules, books, iPads, and beginning school paperwork exchanges will happen at our pre-school open house; allowing for academics and team building to begin the first minute of the first day.
- FSWC Lee has done the collaborative leg work with the FSW School of Education to serve as a host site for Science and Math Interns, Practicum Students, and lower division observation hours. This collaboration will serve both FSW entities and their respective students well as we work together to train new teachers.
- Two new teachers join us with the addition of HOPE (traditionally knows as P.E.) and the replacement of an English teacher who has moved on to teach SLS 1515 here at FSW.

Student Activity News:

- New students will participate in a "Beginning Buccaneer" program designed to help incoming students become familiar with our process and academics. National Honor Society members will initially mentor new students and a deliberate process will inform parents of how we operate and connect new families with families of previously successful students.
- Significant planning is underway for a brand new initiative called STEM and Petals. This

 symposium to connect elementary girls from Tanglewood Elementary with female
 business leaders and owners.
