Highlighted courses satisfy pre-requisite coursework required for entry as a junior into music baccalaureate programs in the State University system.

- It is recommended that music students take MUL 1010 to fulfill their Core Humanities requirement. Most upper division schools require this course for any music degree.
- Taking summer courses can alleviate the heavy credit load in the 3rd semester.
- It is highly recommended that music students take MUS 2360, Intro to Technology in Music.
- Students may take any math that fulfills requirement, LibArts is minimum required. Some students may be required to also take remedial or preparatory math courses first.
