Based on available space, LPNs will be admitted under the Florida Department of Education Gold Statewide Articulation Agreement. All applicants following this plan are evaluated based on a competitive application process. If the applicant does not meet these requirements, it is recommended to follow the College Student Admit and Advising Plan. An ASE1000 block of 11 credits consisting of AS Degree Nursing Core Courses: NUR1020C, NUR1068C, and NUR2092 will be added with a satisfactory grade to the student's record during their final term.

All requirements must be completed prior to the application deadline.

**** Writing Intensive Credits:** Twelve (12) credits of writing intensive credits are required. Students will earn three (3) writing intensive credits with ENC 1101 and three (3) writing intensive credits with ENC 1102. If the student took the recommended Writing Intensive Humanities course for the ASN program, they will earn three (3) writing intensive credits. The additional general education writing intensive humanity course will fulfill this requirement. If the student did not take the recommended Writing Intensive Humanities course for the ASN program, a second writing intensive course will be needed to fulfill this requirement.

***** Foreign Language Requirement / Elective Credits:** All students pursuing a Bachelor's Degree in Florida must complete the Foreign Language and Elective Credit requirements, as outlined in the FSW College Catalog. Please consult with your advisor regarding completion of these requirements. Foreign Language Competency Requirement may be met by:

- 2 years of the same High School Foreign Language, or
- Documented foreign language proficiency through testing, or
- 2 semesters of the same College Level Foreign Language (level II proficiency), or
- Level II proficiency - this criterion occurs when a student has completed the second course of a sequence of college foreign language without completing the first course. For example, if a student has successfully completed a college-level Spanish II but not Spanish I, then the student has met the Foreign Language Competency requirement.
