#### Applicants with College Credits Admit/Advising Plan

A limited number of applicants will be admitted each fall and spring semester. All applicants following this plan will receive a score based on their GPA in the (9) general education courses they have completed that are required for ASN graduation. The top scoring applicants will be selected to test with the Nursing department. Those items will be scored and added to the applicant's initial GPA score. Applicants with the highest total score will be selected for admission to the ASN program.
