#### High School Admit/Advising Plan

Up to two recent high school graduates will be admitted Fall 2023 per cohort. High school graduate applicants must meet the following requirements prior to the ASN application deadline- June 30, 2023. If the applicant does not meet these requirements, it is recommended to follow the College Student Admit/Advising Plan. All high school graduate applicants will receive a score based on their high school GPA. The top scoring applicants will be selected to test with the Nursing department. Those items will be scored and added to the applicant's initial GPA score. Applicants with the highest total score will be selected for admission to the ASN program.

Requirements to Apply to ASN	
REQUIREMENT	MET
Earned a standard high school diploma from a regionally accredited high school in the academic year immediately preceding the ASN application deadline. <i>(See Note Below)</i>	
High school GPA (unweighted) of 3.5 or higher	
Accepted to Florida SouthWestern State College	
Applicant does not require developmental or prerequisite courses	
Transcripts must be received and evaluated by the FSW Registrar's Office and/or Admissions. <i>It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure this is completed by the application deadline. It is recommended that you meet with your current advisor to confirm this is completed.</i>

The additional general education writing intensive humanity course will fulfill this requirement. If the student did not take the recommended humanity for the ASN program, a second writing intensive course will be needed to fulfill this requirement.*
