Bachelor of Science Middle Grades Language Arts

The <u>Bachelor of Science (BS) in Middle Grades Language Arts</u> is a state approved teacher preparation program designed to prepare individuals to teach English/Language Arts in grades 5-9 with Reading and ESOL endorsement. The program provides an educational pathway for students who have earned an Associate in Arts degree to include EDF 2005, EDF 2805 and EME 2040. It is also a good option for students with a child development focus. Upon graduation, students will meet the mandated state teaching requirements, including teacher certification exams with ESOL and Reading Endorsement.

<u>Program Highlights:</u> The BS in Middle Grades Language Arts includes courses that prepare teacher candidates to understand the nature of the adolescent learner and the middle grades philosophy. Content courses cover literature, composition, reading competency, classroom management, assessment and integrated approaches to teaching methodologies at the middle school level. In addition, teacher candidates will take courses to prepare them to teach English language learners (ELLs) and students with exceptionalities. Students will learn to facilitate lessons that integrate the five strands of the language arts (reading, writing speaking, listening, and viewing). Field experience requirements are progressive in nature, building upon previous semester experiences. Students will complete field experience, teach lessons through the practicum courses, and complete a full-time teaching internship in their final semester. Courses are offered for full and part time students, with blended technology and online courses where

Other program requirements include:

- two years of one high school foreign language or two college semesters of one foreign language (prior to entering the final internship FL foreign language requirement)
- maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5
- complete all school based components as required for graduation from the program
- assessment of teacher candidate dispositions throughout the program
- completion of 30 service learning hours prior to final internship
