Lean Processes Overview Workshop

Lean Manufacturing is a journey. Its development must come from a committed management team willing to allow the creativity of the employees to be explored. Lean ideology is meant to identify and eliminate non-value added actions, reduce non-value added but necessary actions, and expand value added actions can be discovered in a classroom environment which is allowed to measure, or estimate the size of a non-value added waste to demonstrate the effect of the changes to be achieved and therefore the movement toward a defined goal.

Once seminar participants understand the goal then the principles of how to deploy lean tools can be taught. Specific lean tool examples of deployment would cover how to utilize 5S, and on signals, bottleneck analysis, smooth process flows, go & see activities (gemba), level scheduling, strategic policy deployment alignment to individual goals, simplified automation, just in time concepts, key process metrics for a balanced scorecard, value stream mapping, error proofing levels and standardized work.

 - **Reducing excessive inventory**
 - **Reducing excessive motion by people or equipment**
 - **Eliminating waiting**
 - **Eliminating overproduction**
 - **Eliminating over processing**

 - **Identifying unused human talent**
