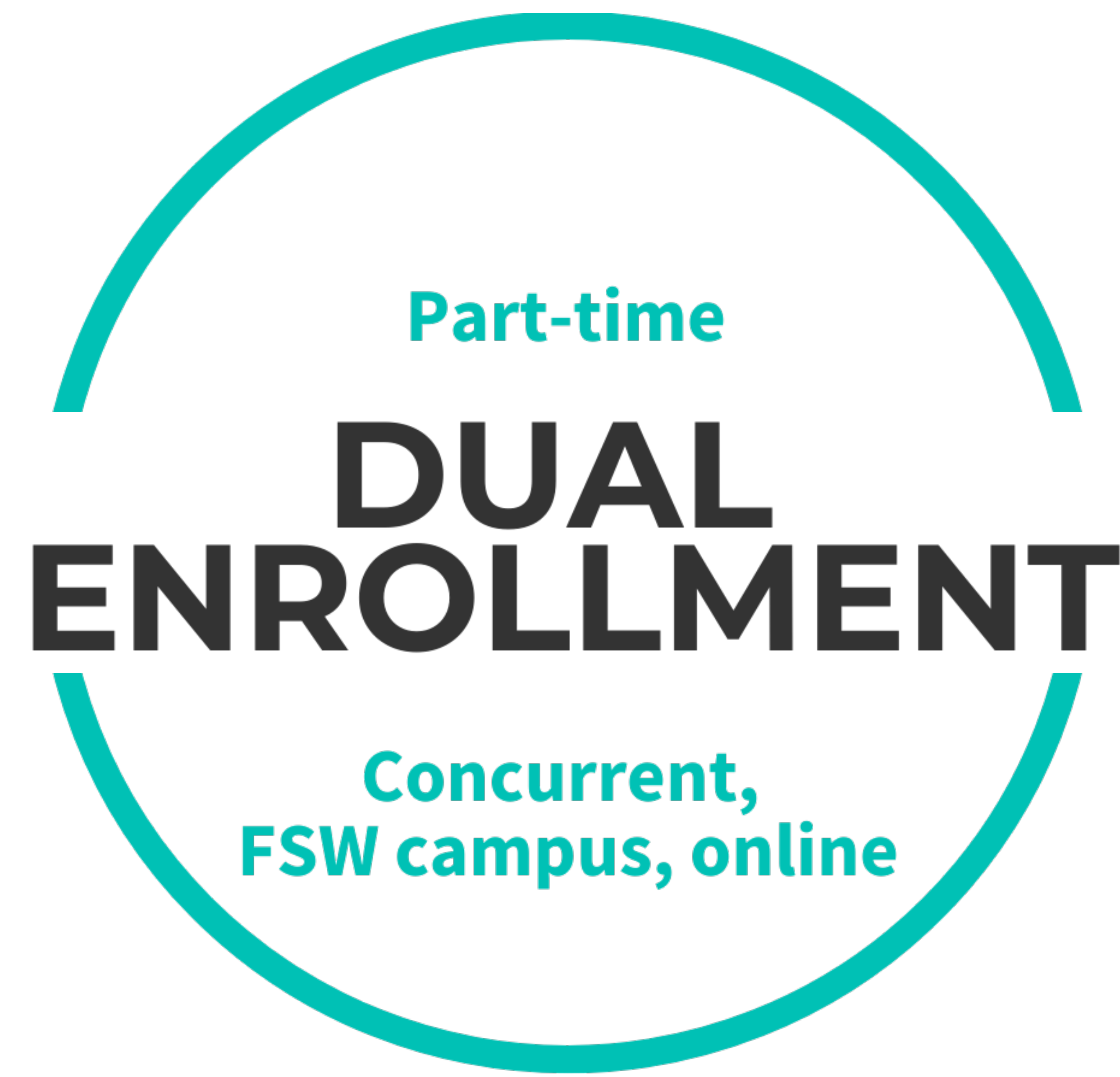

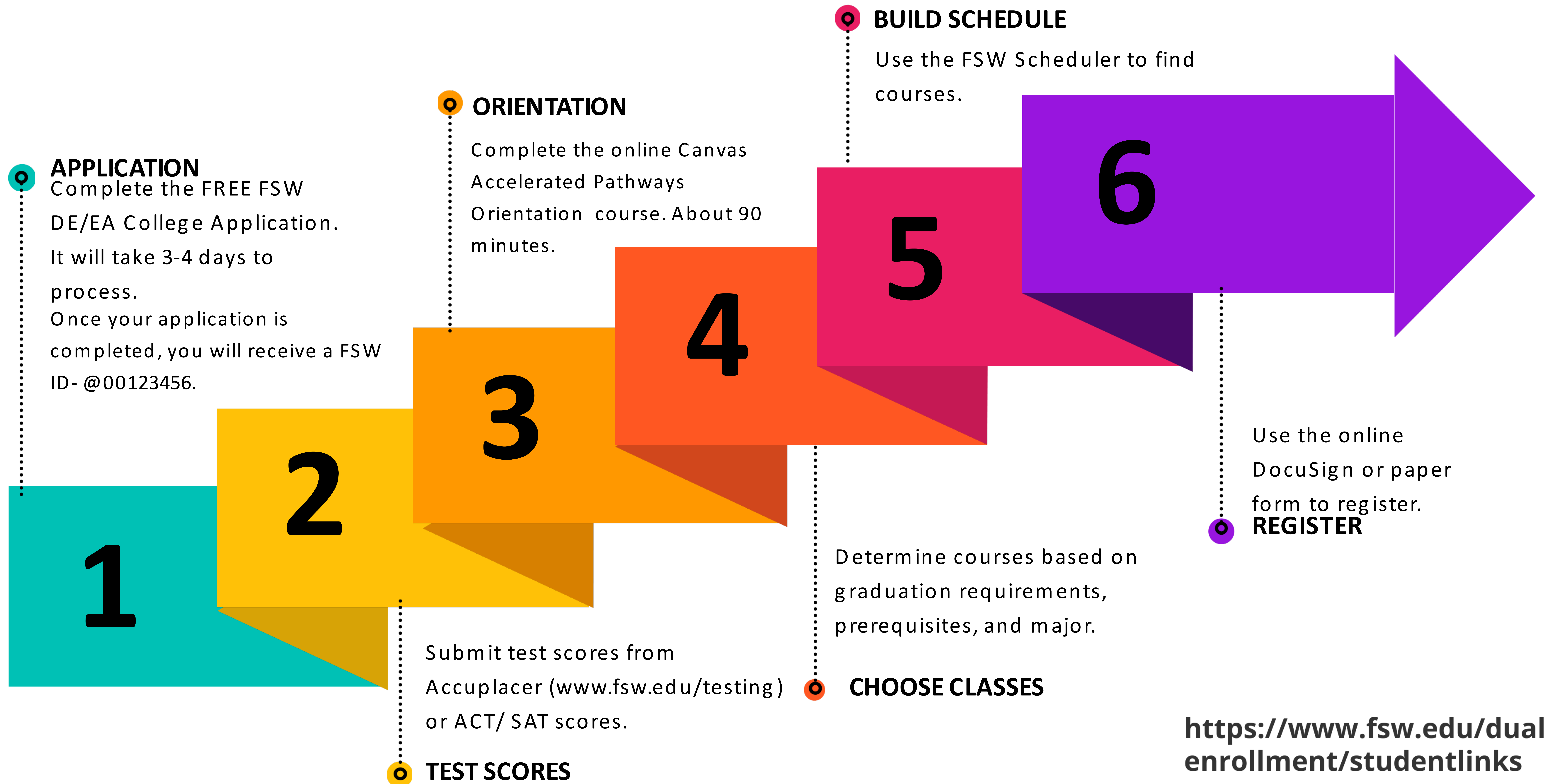
6th-10th grade

- 3.5 unweighted high school grade point average
- Must have 5 core class credits
- Eligible test scores
- Access to dual enrollment
- Limited to 9 credits per semester
- Must maintain high school GPA and 2.0 college GPA

11th-12th grade

- 3.0 unweighted high school grade point average
- Eligible test scores
- Access to dual enrollment and early admissions
- Must maintain high school GPA and 2.0 college GPA

DOE Legislation

Civics Exam

- DE students are encouraged to take the exam at their high school for graduation requirements. Passing the exam will be a requirement for the AA, including taking either AMH 2020 or
- Note, ALL seniors will be considered FTIC when matriculating to a college (FCS/ SUS), meaning they will be required to take even if they have an AA or substantial credit.

DOE Legislation

Summer D E

- MOU has been updated and sent to districts.
- April 15th registration deadline
- Textbooks through FSW-Lee Bookstore (possible partnership with district on already purchased books)
- Full Term
- Mini-A and/or Mini-B limit to 1 per term
- 6th-10th (rising 11th), 3.5 unweighted GPA, up to 9 credits
- 11th (rising 12th), 3.0 unweighted GPA, up to 12 credits
- No D E summer after 12th grade year

Alternative Assessments

- FCS current memo states we "may" use alternative assessments.
- Have to petition the FLDOE for alternative assessments to use
- No intention of pursuing for DE at the point, possibility of FTIC students
- If included, it will be incorporated into the IAA

CLEP

ByPass

FSW offers the CLEP exam twice a month with a [registration form](#). Popular exams are American Government, College Algebra, College Composition, History of the United States I & II, and Foreign Language (French, German, Spanish).

PERT (135+), ACT (25+) or SAT (29+), they may schedule to take the Advanced Algebra and Functions (AAF) Test. Based on scoring, students may be eligible to take the Trigonometry Bypass Exam for MAC 1114 to enter into MAC 2311.

FSW ACCELERATED PATHWAYS RETESTING

1st Testing Attempt

- Must take full battery- Reading, Writing & Math
- May submit ACT and/or SAT scores directly to FSW on campus with photo ID
- Must have application and FSW ID
- Can either test on-campus, through Zoom, or through the school

2nd & 3rd Testing Attempt

- Will only need to take area(s) deficient
- Must wait 30 days for remediation
- Can either test on-campus, through Zoom, or through the school
- Maximum 3 attempts total
- Early attempt possible with counselor recommendation to DE Office

SPECIAL DE HOLDS



AS

Accelerated Form- This is for all DE students, which prevents online registration



TE

Testing Hold- Student is missing a Writing and/or Math score. Limited to 12 credits.



EA

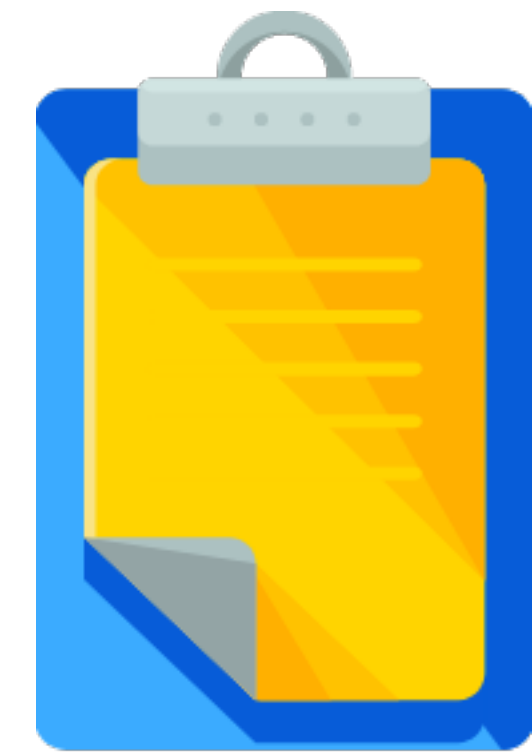
Early Admissions Hold- Student has 25+ credits and is required to see FSW advisor prior to registering.



DS

Home School Documents- Additional documentation required for home ed. students.

Used for both pre-requisite override and credit.

Pre-req- requires transcript at Registration

Credit- requires official score report to Registrar.

HOW TO CHOOSE COURSES

H.S. Grad

High school graduation requirements always come first.

Prerequisites

Different majors require specific core and elective courses. Students need to have the correct pre-reqs for their major.

Future College

In the Florida SUS and FCS system, all credits will transfer by state law.

Other Acceleration (AP, Cambridge AICE, IB)

Many high school students do not understand how their high school acceleration credits (Advanced Placement, Cambridge AICE, and International Baccalaureate) transfer as college credit and end up taking unnecessary classes. The Florida Department of Education has outlined how accelerated credits from these programs will transfer based on test scores. Students should work with FSW advisors to determine what credits they should receive, how to receive them, and how these courses meet possible prerequisites, general education, or elective credit.

If students have met FSW prerequisites through AP, Cambridge AICE or IB, school counselors will need to submit transcripts with the student's registration form showing the passing score.
