## What do you enjoy most about teaching the Cornerstone Experience course?

The overall experience of watching and helping students who are from very different places in life and heading in very different directions work together is very rewarding. It is rewarding to see how students are willing to give a kind of random set of experiences with strangers a chance to turn into something. In short, watching individuals grow and interact with each other is the best thing.

#### Why did you choose to teach SLS 1515?

The main reason I wanted to teach the class is that I wanted to see if any sort of structured program could help get a handle on the intangible skill of being "college ready." As a long time high school administrator, this topic has presented challenges and rewards. So often this is kind of hoped for by both high school personnel, college personnel, parents, and students to see and help make positive contributions to a system that does this is fun.

#### How did the course change you?

Having students from all walks of life, different motivational structures, different goals, and no real connection to each other all work together is encouraging. It kind of renews my faith in people in general because even when there is resistance or friction to the course or between participants, they always seem to find a way to put that behind them. It also reminds me that as a leader, people are always watching and wanting authentic interactions. I can't give a lesson on money management or setting priorities if there isn't evidence in my own life that those topics are priorities. I try to listen to my own lessons as much as I give them.
