LIT 2000: INTRODUCTION TO LITERATURE



Frankenstein and the Rise of Gothic Literature offers students the opportunity to traverse Scotland and England, home to Mary Shelley, creator of Frankenstein's monster, to see how place, time, and circumstance shaped the rise of Gothic horror. Students will analyze the power of storytelling in folk tales, ghost stories, and modern works that probe the human psyche in fiction, poetry, and dramatic formats. Abroad, they will explore London, Edinburgh, and surrounding sites, recreating Shelley's cross-country experiences through train travel. Returning, students will complete a travelogue, connecting their experiences to the influence of place, history, and literature on society.
