


Unduplicated 12-month headcount and total FTE, by student level: 2018-19






Percent of all students enrolled, by race/ethnicity: Fall 2019




Graduation rates of full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates within 150% of normal time to program completion, by Title IV aid status: 2013 cohort




Award and enrollment rates of degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students who entered the institution in 2011-12, by cohort






Percent of full-time, first-time entering students receiving an award at four, six, and eight years after entry, by type of award and Pell status






Percent distribution of core revenues, by source: Fiscal year 2019




