Associate in Arts (AA) Meta-Major: Social and Behavioral Sciences and Human Services

- 1. Arts, humanities, communication and design.
- 2. Business.
- 3. Education.
- 4. Health sciences.
- 5. Industry/manufacturing and construction.
- 6. Public Safety.
- 7. Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
- 8. Social and behavioral sciences and human services.

The Associate in Arts (AA) degree is a total of 60 credits, including 36 general education credits outlined in the <u>General Education</u> <u>Program Guide</u> and 24 elective credits.
