# Developmental Course Completion Routes

## Developmental Reading

REA 0019

### TRADITIONAL (for non-exempt students)

The student

- places into developmental course through placement testing.
- enrolls in REA 0019.
- completes requirements of course, common course assessments, and course Post-Test with an overall average minimum grade of 70%.

### EXEMPTION by Documented Student Achievement

Students may receive exemption during the admission or initial advising process. On a case by case basis and with an academic administrator's approval (in consultation with department chair or course coordinator), non-exempt students testing in REA 0019 may receive a "non-exempt permitted (NEPD)" due to documented student achievement. Documentation may include (but is not limited to) the following:

- documented indicators of college readiness, for example, GPA in High School English classes.
- successful completion of state-approved MOOC.

### BYPASS REA 0019 to ENC 1101

With instructor's approval, the student

- takes the REA 0019 Reading Competencies Pre-test.
- obtains a score of 85% or higher to bypass or alternatively complete REA 0019.

### EARLY EXIT out of REA 0019

The student

- begins course with a diagnostic pre-test to identify strengths and weaknesses.
- completes modules identified by pre-test with a 70% or higher.
- completes the individualized modular plan and takes a post-test with a minimum score of 70% or higher.

# Developmental Course Completion Routes

## Developmental Writing

ENC 0022

### TRADITIONAL (for non-exempt students)

The student

- places into developmental course through placement testing.
- enrolls in ENC 0022.
- completes requirements of course, common course assessment, and course mastery exam with a minimum grade of "C."

### EXEMPTION by Documented Student Achievement

Students may receive exemption during the admission or initial advising process. On a case by case basis and with an academic administrator's approval (in consultation with department chair or course coordinator), non-exempt students testing in ENC 0022 may receive a "non-exempt permitted (NEPD)" due to documented student achievement. Documentation may include (but is not limited to) the following:

- documented indicators of college readiness, for example, GPA in High School English classes
- successful completion of state-approved MOOC.

### BYPASS ENC 0022 to ENC 1101

- During Add/Drop week, at the discretion of the ENC 0022 professor based on diagnostic tests given the first class days, the student may be offered the opportunity to submit previous written work showing the incorporation of research and proper citation and to take the ENC 0022 Course Final Exam to bypass ENC 0022.
- If the student work reflects appropriate writing and research skills (based on instructor evaluation) and the student scores 90% or better on the ENC 0022 Course Mastery Exam, he or she may bypass the ENC 0022 class and enroll in an ENC 1101 class for that semester, pending a REA hold.
- Enrollment in ENC 1101 class is based on time and availability.

### EARLY EXIT out of ENC 0022

Successful completion of modules with a score of 70% and successful completion of ENC 0022 Course Mastery Exam with a score of 70% or better.

# Developmental Course Completion Routes

## Developmental Mathematics

### MAT 0057

#### **TRADITIONAL (for non-exempt students)**

The non-exempt student

- places into developmental course through placement testing.
- enrolls in MAT 0057.
- completes requirements of course, including achieving a 70% or better on each Module test, completing the final exam, and earning at least an overall course grade of "C."

#### **EXEMPTION by Documented Student Achievement**

Students may receive exemption during the admission or initial advising process. On a case by case basis and with an academic administrator's approval (in consultation with department chair or course coordinator), non-exempt students testing in MAT 0057 may receive a "non-exempt permitted (NEPD)" due to documented student achievement. Documentation may include (but is not limited to) the following:

- documented indicators of college readiness, for example, GPA in High School Mathematics classes.
- successful completion of state-approved MOOC.

#### **EARLY EXIT out of MAT 0057**

- Students who demonstrate mastery of some course outcomes through the advising tool may (upon instructor approval) be permitted to complete the Module tests to demonstrate competency and expedite completion of the course.
- Any student who successfully completes all the course requirements before the end of a semester may be allowed to take the final exam and finish the course early.

#### **BYPASS MAT 1033 or MAT 1100 in order to enroll in college level math courses**

- Students who complete MAT0057 with a grade of "A" are eligible to re-take the math portion of the PERT and will be allowed to bypass MAT 1033 or MAT 1100 if they earn a score which places them into a college-level math course.
