FSW's Audio Technology program supports students in developing the skills and experience for careers in the music and entertainment industry. Audio Technology students learn fundamental audio concepts and processing principles, gain experience with acoustical balancing, editing, and overdubbing in a wide range of sound situations, and investigate advanced multi-track recording skills and audio production techniques.

The certificate prepares students for further education and careers as technicians or audio engineers and provides additional training for people who have worked in the field of music, entertainment, or similar industries in the past or present. With evolving technology and the continued impact of music on our culture, having an occupation in this field is both relevant and meaningful.

During times of uncertainty, clarity can come from unexpected places. Just ask thirty-three-year-old musician Taylor Freydberg, a student who came to FSW at a time when his life felt stagnant. Taylor mentioned that in his professional life, he felt trapped in a cycle, and to break free, he came to FSW on the recommendation of a friend. When he initially enrolled, Taylor only aimed to earn the Audio Technology Certificate. But now, he is in his final semester and will graduate with three credentials.

When asked why he continued pursuing higher credentials here at FSW, he remarked on how while going through the certificate program, he had grown so much as a musician that it just made sense to continue that growth in a place where he enjoyed the learning environment, felt he got an authentic

college experience and could achieve musical knowledge on a college level. He also praised Professor Mike Molloy, noting that his lessons helped optimize and refine systems and skills Taylor uses every day in his career and how the Audio Technology program helped him attain clarity and depth in topics necessary to his field of study.



Since earning his certificate in Audio Technology, Taylor has traveled to Mykonos, Greece, where he worked on video and audio production for Sweat Vacay. This company gathers fitness instructors worldwide to film and hold classes in various athletic fields. He helped their company develop a prominent online presence by recording live acoustic music, editing videos, and working on voice-over dialog.

Now, Taylor hopes to earn a position at Artis—Naples as an audio engineer, where he will put his audio engineering skills to use. At the end of the interview, Taylor shared some advice for students at FSW "Focus on the material, listen to your Professors, and put yourself on a dedicated path to success. Opportunities will arise as those around you notice how driven you are."

EMS Program Prepares 118 Students for Roles as First Responders

The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) department prepares students for careers as Firefighters, EMTs, and Paramedics. FSW celebrates the successes of 60 EMT students, 41 Firefighter students, and 17 paramedic students who graduated in December and will fill critical roles in our community as first responders. Upon completion of certificate programs at FSW, EMT, Firefighter, and Paramedic students are eligible to sit for corresponding state and national licensure examinations. FSW's December Paramedic graduates pictured above left, completed over 1200 hours of training. Firefighter graduates complete 492 hours of training and EMT graduates complete a total of 300 hours, respectively.

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)


Lee County's Economic Development Office awarded FSW \$1 million to providing funding for select credit and non-credit workforce programs offered at FSW. Lee County residents who enroll into ARPA-eligible programs may be qualify for funding to cover in-state tuition and fees.



Open Door Grant

FSW received \$316,019 of Open Door Grant funding through the Florida Department of Education. These funds will help students fast-track their success in a short-term career and technical education program.







Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)

Coming soon – anticipated availability for Summer 2023

FSW was awarded \$1.98 million for its Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Grant proposal to provide residents of southwest Florida an expanded pathway to multiple in-demand industry certificates. Certificates include AutoCAD, Microsoft Office Word, PowerPoint, and Excel Associate, Microsoft Excel Expert, CompTIA A+, CompTIA A++, CompTIA Linux +, CompTIA Network+, and CompTIA Security +. Participants will be supported through enhanced coursework, supplemental certification boot camps, and personalized advising.
