

# Public Administration Assessment Report

## 1 INTRODUCTION

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Florida SouthWestern State College's Business Department gathers a multitude of data from various courses as assessment tools in support of the Florida Department of Education Curriculum Framework. The courses included in assessment are PAD 3204 *Financial Management in the Public Sector*, PAD 4332 *Strategic and Operational Planning*, PAD 4414 *Human Resources in Public Service*, and PAD 4878 *Public Safety Administration Capstone*. The assessment outcomes are intended to provide a baseline and measurement of achievement moving forward. The assessment plan also provides combined results of all PAD courses, comparisons between dual enrollment and non-dual enrollment students, online versus traditional students, and by site, where possible. Where data is sufficient, additional analyses are provided including distribution studies and longitudinal studies.

## 2 PAD 3204

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### 2.1 LEARNING OBJECTIVES AND DESCRIPTIVE STATISTICS

The FSW Business faculty defined one area of interest for evaluation in support of the state framework which was clarified for the spring 2019 term. The outcomes related to PAD 3204 are:

- PAD PO2 - Formulate a public policy proposal.
- PAD PO3 - Justify the validity and reliability of a program.
- PAD PO5 - Demonstrate knowledge of laws and regulations regarding labor relations and hiring/firing practices.
- PAD PO6 - Analyze and develop planning strategies in response to homeland security issues including public relations, terrorism and emergency management.
- PAD PO7 - Employ a series of strategies, including quality assurance, and critical thinking to manage activities ranging from normal to special assignments.
- PAD PO8 - Identify components of a public agency financial system and explain how each fits into the overall organizational structure.

The measurement and objectives related to PAD 3204 are:

- ❖ Outcome 1 – The total scores measured (combined total of assignments associated with Program Outcome) average '4' or higher and that 100% of artifacts score '4' or better. {This outcome is measured both by course (PAD 3204) and across all PAD courses (see Section 5 for results).}

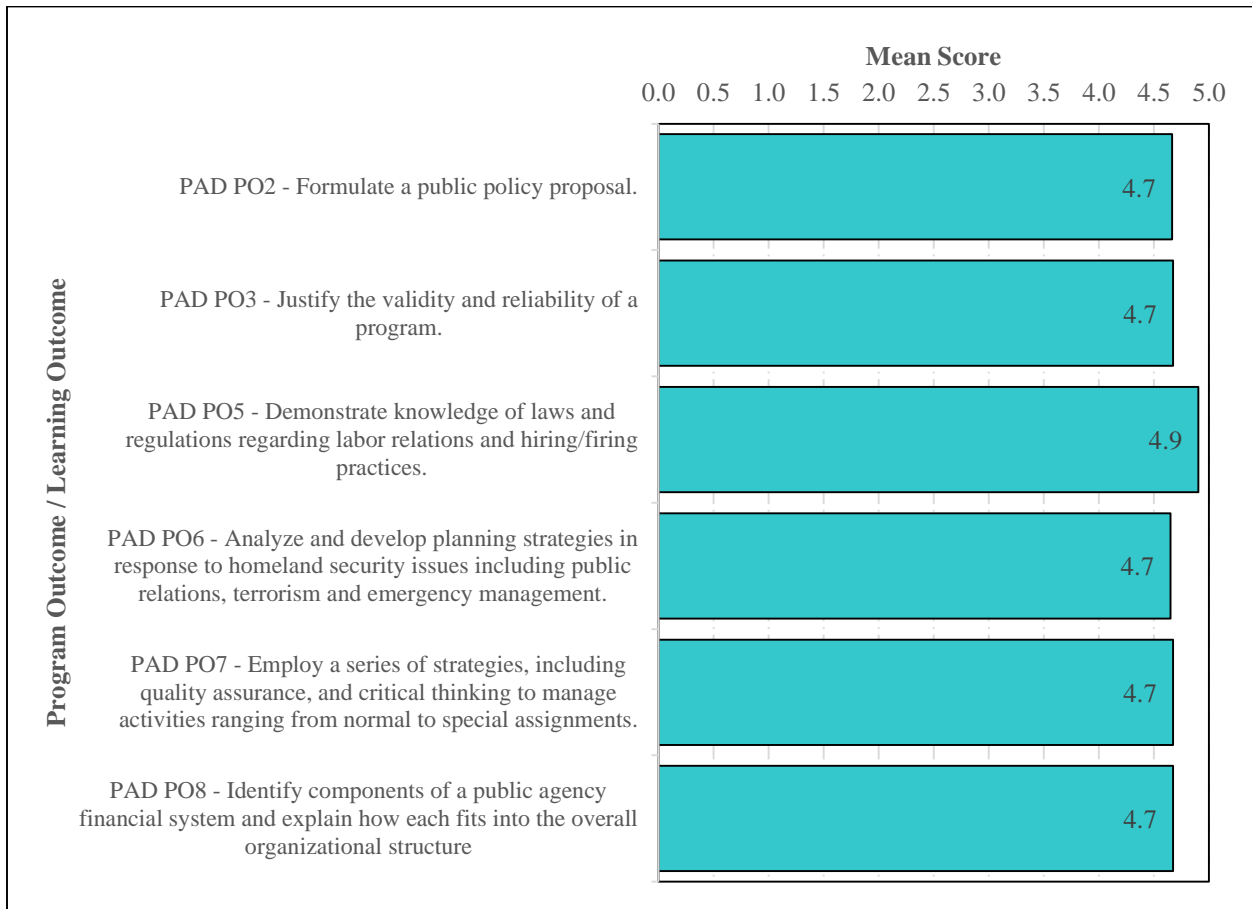


Figure 1. Bar graph of mean score by Outcome for PAD 3204.

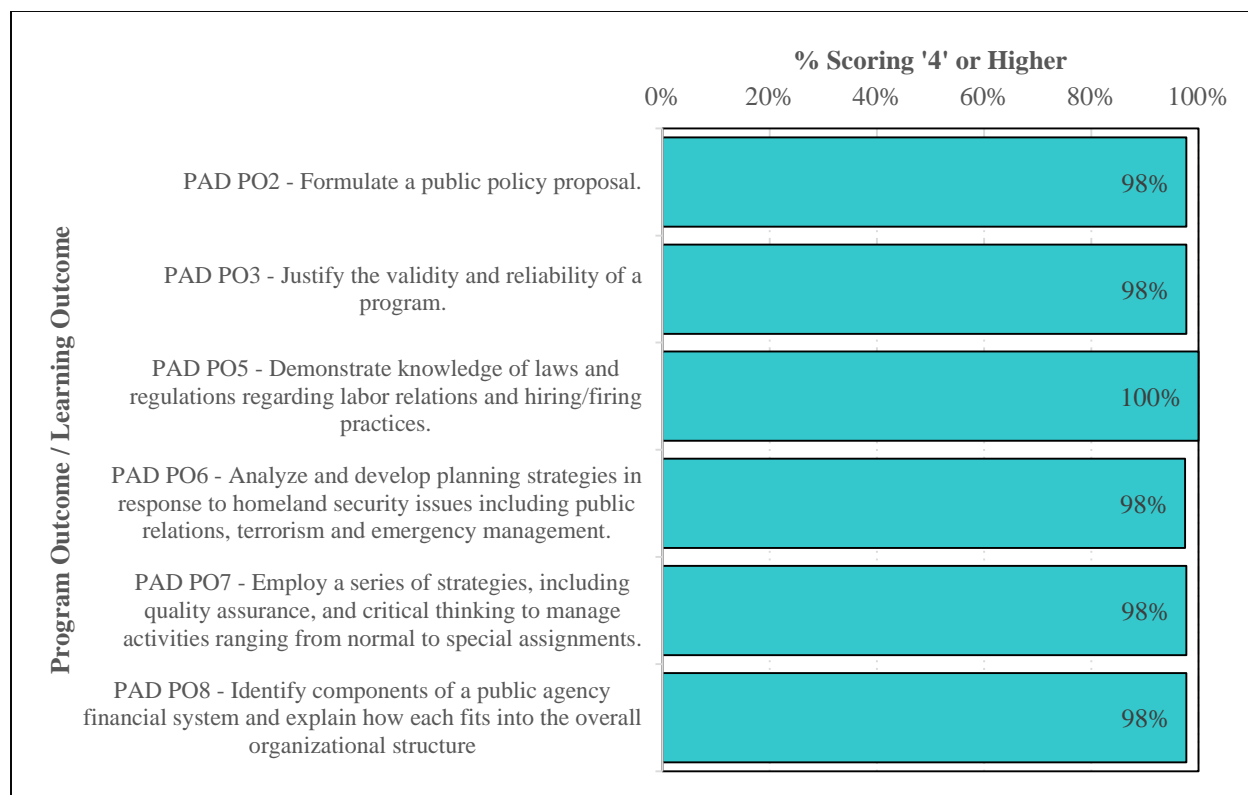


Figure 2. Bar graph of percentage of artifacts scoring '4' or higher by Outcome for PAD 3204.

During the spring 2019 semester, an enrollment of 21 contributed to scores tallied from 1 of 1 sections of PAD 3204. Descriptive statistics for achievement of outcomes are shown in Table 1. The graphical representation of mean scores is shown in Figure 1 and percentage of artifacts scoring '4' or higher is shown in Figure 2. Outcome means range from 4.7 to 4.9. Outcome percentages scoring '4' or better range from 98% to 100%. The goal that the total scores measured (combined total of assignments associated with Program Outcome) average '4' or higher and that 100% of artifacts score '4' or better was met.

## 2.2 EXPLORATORY ANALYSIS AND SIGNIFICANCE TESTING

Multiple comparisons of artifact scores across varying formats, campuses, and student types were made, where possible, in order to add depth to the causes of the distribution of the artifacts. Each course was divided into the appropriate subgroups to perform the analysis. In cases where a subgroup is not represented in the course comparisons were not conducted and are noted for comprehensiveness.

### 2.2.1 Dual Enrollment to Non-Dual Enrollment Comparison

No dual enrollment sections of the course were run during spring 2019 so no comparison study between dual enrollment and non-dual enrollment could be completed.

### 2.2.2 Online to Traditional Comparison

Only one section of the course was run during the spring 2019 semester and so no comparison of online to traditional sections could be completed.

### 2.2.3 Comparison by Campus/Site

Only one section of the course was run during the spring 2019 semester and so no cross-campus comparison could be completed.

## 2.3 LONGITUDINAL STUDY

As further data is collected in coming terms, this section will track achievement through time and highlight strengths, weaknesses and any long term trends beginning with the next suite of data collected.

### 5 PAD 4878 CAPSTONE ASSESSMENT

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#### 5.1 LEARNING OBJECTIVES AND DESCRIPTIVE STATISTICS

The FSW Business faculty defined three areas of interest for evaluation in support of the state framework which was clarified for the 2016-2017 Academic Year. For the Academic Year this Program Outcome has so far been measured in the Fall 2018 and Spring 2019 sessions of the Capstone Class. The measurements are as follows:

- ❖ Outcome 1 – 80% of candidates will earn a grade of 80% or higher on the Capstone outcome scores for Fall 2018.
- ❖ Outcome 2 – 80% of candidates will earn a grade of 80% or higher on the Capstone outcome scores for Spring 2019.
- ❖ Outcome 3 – 80% of candidates will earn a grade of 80% or higher on the Capstone outcome scores for Summer 2019.

So far during AY 2018-2019, 16 scores were tallied from 3 of 3 sections of PAD 4878. Descriptive statistics for achievement of outcomes are shown in Table 5. ***The goal that 80% of candidates will earn a grade of 80% or higher on the Capstone outcome will be measured following the completion of AY 2018-2019 as it is in review of the entire academic year.***

## 6 CONCLUSIONS

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FSW's Business Department gathers a multitude of data from various courses as assessment tools in support of the Florida Department of Education Curriculum Framework. The course included in assessment is PAD 3204 *Financial Management in the Public Sector*, PAD 4332 *Strategic and Operational Planning*, PAD 4414 *Human Resources in Public Service*, and PAD 4878 *Public Safety Administration Capstone*. The assessment outcomes are intended to provide a baseline and measurement of achievement moving forward.

### 6.1 PAD 3204

A drill-down of PAD 3204 results are as follows:

1. In a study of outcome achievement, the goal that the total scores measured (combined total of assignments associated with Program Outcome) average '4' or higher and that 100% of artifacts score '4' or better was met. Outcome means range from 4.7 to 4.9. Outcome percentages scoring '4' or better range from 98% to 100%.
2. No dual enrollment sections of the course were run during spring 2019 so no comparison study between dual enrollment and non-dual enrollment could be completed.
3. Only one section of the course was run during the spring 2019 semester and so no comparison of online to traditional sections could be completed.
4. Only one section of the course was run during the spring 2019 semester and so no cross-campus comparison could be completed.

### 6.2 PAD 4332

No course sections of PAD 4332 were run during spring 2019, so no analysis could be completed.

### 6.3 PAD 4414

No course sections of PAD 4414 were run during spring 2019, so no analysis could be completed.

### 6.4 PAD 4878 CAPSTONE ASSESSMENT

The assessment plan for PAD courses measures achievement for the Capstone outcome for Fall 2018, Spring 2019, and Summer 2019. The goal that 80% of candidates will earn a grade of 80% or higher on the Capstone outcome will be measured following the completion of AY 2018-2019 as it is in review of the entire academic year. Currently, 8 of 8 POs are meeting the goal.
