

Dr. McVannel-Erwin is an Adjunct Professor for the Human Services Program, School of Health Professions and for FSW Online. She has been a Licensed Mental Health Counselor licensed to practice counseling since 2001, a Nationally Certified Counselor, a Certified Addictions Professional and a Board Certified Human Service Professional. Additionally, she is a State of Florida Clinical Supervisor and Certified Hypnotherapist. She has extensive training in the field of human services and counseling.

Dr. McVannel-Erwin holds a Ph.D. in Counselor Education and a Certificate in Women's Studies from Ohio University (2007). She has a Master's of Education degree in Community Mental Health Counseling from Ohio University (2001). Dr. McVannel-Erwin was the recipient of the Donald A. Green Memorial Award (2003) due to outstanding service as a graduate student in the Counselor Education Program at Ohio University.

As a therapist in private practice (2008-present), Dr. McVannel-Erwin specializes in individual, group and marriage/family counseling as well as addictions counseling and hypnotherapy. She was a Visiting Research Associate at the University of Central Florida (2007-08) and was a Program Specialist and Advisor at Edison State College (now FSW) in the Student Success Program (2004-05). Dr. McVannel-Erwin served as the Executive Director of a domestic violence shelter in Kentucky and was the Director of a West Virginia community service agency. She has served in a number of community mental health centers and medical clinics as a counselor and leader and has taught American Sign Language as a high school teacher.

Dr. McVannel-Erwin is a member of the Editorial Board for the *Journal of GLBT issues in Counseling* (2005-present) and a member of numerous professional organizations. She has been published in numerous journals including *Counseling Today*, the *Journal of Counseling and Development*, the *Journal of Homosexuality*, and *Women and Therapy*.
