Possible tasks for Academic Standards Committee Fall 2012/Spring 2013	Suggestions from Faculty Senate for possible Fall 2012/Spring 2013 tasks were discussed: Code of Conduct Course Waivers and Appeal Forms Integrity of Program Requirements Book Reps/Book Buyers on Campus Attendance Verification Time Limits New Statewide Reduction of Gen Ed Courses		
2.	Code of Conduct	 Russ Watjen asked for faculty feedback on the revised code. Send it out to all faculty; Academic Standards collect, analyze, report. Committee agreed that the new code is much more detailed than the present code Needs formalized outline of student/faculty step-by-step line of progression Can begin to reorganize and make suggestions as soon as new organizational structure of college determined 		
3.	Course Waivers and Appeal Forms	 The two new forms need to be more uniform with respect to signatures Committee recommended re-evaluating the Course Substitution Forms form last semester to ensure all three forms are consistent 		
4.	Integrity of Program Requirements	 Committee will ask for report from the SAC group currently working on this task Committee will review report, make suggestions, report to Faculty Senate 		



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5.	Book Reps/Book Buyers	 Committee discussed pros and cons for visits from book representatives Some departments are not allowing gifts or lunches; others have no rule College needs consistency in rules Selling books to book buyers was described as unethical during the Ethics Conference Spring 2012 Policy may be in order for book buyers
6.	Attendance Verification	 A committee is already looking into attendance verification time limits and the College calendar year Academics Standards Committee will consult with committee and review documents
7.	Statewide Reduction of Gen Ed Courses	 Faculty Senate suggested since Marty Ambrose is working with FGCU representative on the State level committee, Academic Standards should contact Marty for updates Once State decides on official list of core gen eds, Academic Standards can begin reviewing and making suggestions for our College
