The current requirement for Core General Education humanities has backlogged HUM 2020 and LIT 2000 with students attempting to get into the Nursing program (estimated sometimes at hundreds of students). State requires only a normal gen ed requirement in humanities. For students who will later continue from the A.S. to the B.S.N. they will be required to take the core humanities writing intensive course to fulfill baccalaureate gen ed requirements. That number of students is far smaller than those attempting to get into the A.S. program; thus the impact on HUM 2020 and LIT 2000 will be much smaller. Previous Curriculum Committee minutes illustrate that the previous Dean was cautioned against making the change to Core Humanities, writing intensive; however, the change was still made and is reflected in the 2017-18 and 2018-19 catalogs.
