Inclusion of GEB 2930 Special Topics/Capstone course material into RMI 2662 enhances the last course of the RMI sequence while aiding in streamlining the AS in Business Administration RMI specialization and CCC in Risk Management so that the Certificate can be earned within both the 24 hour certificate requirement limitation and the 60 hour AS degree 60 hour requirement limitation.
