1. Welcome and Call to Order – E. Pritchett opened the meeting at 11:03am
2. Review of October 2020 meeting minutes
 - a. Motion to approve: M. Coman
 - b. Seconded: T. Donaldson
 - c. **Meeting minutes for October were approved.**
3. Course Level update
 - a. For traditional courses, scantron packets are now available in faculty mailboxes.
4. General Education Assessment update

- a. New Scoring Plan: Canvas will be used to score this year. Team AASPIRE is putting together a demo of the Canvas Course for GenEd Assessment for the Dec. LAC meeting.
 - b. Scoring Members: There are enough scorers to greatly reduce the number of artifacts that each scorer reviews.
 - c. GenEd Feedback Booklet
 - 1. After the Evaluate GenEd professional development workshop last month, a faculty member from School of Pure and Applied Science shared an exemplar for Evaluate, and it is now up on the GenEd Assessment website.
5. Syllapalooza
- a. Advertising and Details: Elijah invited learning assessment coordinators to share from the work that departments have been doing recently regarding Syllapalooza and promoting conversations around course alignment to General Education competencies.
 - 1. A. Trogan shared that a pre-survey was conducted in English department. Feedback indicates that there is strong alignment between competencies and class learning, but other outcomes from discussion over reading syllabi with fresh eyes holds additional value, and is looking forward to updates later with further feedback from a post-survey.
 - 2. K. Moran shared that math department has particular challenges at this time with transporting the large numbers of class sections consistently to the variety and significance of modality changes so that has left little room for syllabi and competency review, but the general sense is that the curriculum content is currently strongly aligned to competencies.
 - 3. E. Pritchett shared that conversations recently focused on reviewing syllabi led to at least one ethics class that may be making some changes to outcomes and/or the competency alignment.
 - 4. M. Coman shared that review of physics classes show strong alignment to competencies. Some changes are being considered for other science classes. The department has also discovered through discussions that recent and abrupt switches to new classroom modalities highlight interaction between course outcome alignments and student adjustments to learning in new online formats. Overall, the department historically chose conservative numbers of competencies so conversations now are focused on opening up possibilities and value in considering multiple integral and/or secondary competencies.
 - 5. The committee discussed how assessment covers a wide variety of perspectives when embedded in different departments.
6. DataVersed Newsletter
- a. C. Seefchak presented draft of the Holidata December and group discussed other elements which will include brief data column and chair introduction.

- a. E. Pritchett shared recent COP timelines for committee chair terms are now three years.
