- 2. Approval of December 2021 meeting minutes December Meeting Minutes were approved

- 3. Calibration Session Continued -THINK with a second assignment sample
  - a. Committee practiced application of THINK rubric and discussed the nuances of interpreting a threaded discussion artifact as students are engaged in using knowledge actively in conversation, which does not necessarily lend to explicitly describing their understandings of topics, but that scorers can look for evidence of being open to new ideas. Other points of discussion included:
    - 1. Evidence: The flexibility of wording in the Evidence dimension which allows for application to a range of assignments via "viewpoints from experts if required," specifically between the deficient and development achievement levels.
    - 2. Student's Position (perspective): Nuances of applying the action verbs in this dimension and across the General Education Assessment rubrics. Committee noted that this could be an important area to review with scorer feedback in the future.
    - 3. Conclusions and Related Outcomes: Nuances of applying the rubric's emphasis on evidence, especially with an assignment that gives students an opportunity to explore problems, solutions, or perspectives in a hypothetical scenario. It was further noted that the format of a discussion thread emphasizes exchange of ideas versus conclusions.
