Roz: anybody using Hypothesis, a social annotation tool? Roz: we could have a "webinar watch party" on Teams

Lenny: potential 6 modules ideas/proposal:

- 1) Sharing OER experiences
- 2) Discipline specific OER
- 3) OER test banks
- 4) Different OER tools (Hypothesis)
- 5) Ideas from OER DEV materials (Arenthia)
- 6) Webinar watch party

Jill: we could also showcase additional tools, such as, for example, H5p

ii. How exactly will we offer it?

Roz suggested using Canvas catalogue. Advantages: we can give an automatic badge option.

Lenny mentioned using a Canvas Toolkit. Advantages: it can become a resource that can be available anytime.

Alessandro suggested using Teams. Advantages: we can create a learning community. It can be used as a primary option or a supplemental option. Informal vote by showing hands. Results: Roz will volunteer to get the Team created and the Canvas Catalog part set up.

Jill: participants from the OER institutes can volunteer.

Roz: everybody in the committee can also volunteer and create and/or cocreate material for the modules.

Updates from Textbook Affordability Committee semester meeting.
 The committee charge is to collaborate and determine opportunities to reduce the financial impact to students resulting from the rising costs of textbooks and learning materials. Cost reduction strategies will be applied where appropriate and conducive to the achievement of course learning outcomes.

Lenny: the big takeaway:

- To replace/reconsider Follet.
- To transition to digital.
- How we can track OER usage at the college.

Dr. Page: The low-cost designation. What does low-cost mean?

Roz: There is an "Affordability Counts" change proposal. \$40 per class regardless of the credit count. If \$40 is the dollar amount that we land on, that would still fit within the "Affordability Counts" criteria. Affordability Counts was created as a direct response to the increasing costs of textbooks in higher education. The program recognizes faculty who take steps in their courses to advance affordability across Florida state universities and colleges.

Alessandro: it might be helpful to consider the cost related to credit-hour pros and cons. \$20 per credit sounds reasonable. For example, USF consider \$60 for a 3-credit class affordable.
